In conjunction with the Liverpool City Council Physical Activity and Sports Development Department, Royal Albert Dock Events Team and the Liverpool Table Tennis League, a day of table tennis was held on a floating pontoon in the Royal Albert Dock.

The pontoon table tennis day was held as part of a 'Wellbeing Week' when various sports used the pontoon to encourage the public to take part in a sport.

Tom Purcell, organising secretary of the League, said: "It was great to see so many people taking part in table tennis from all ages and abilities. 171 people played on the day; 95 children, 40 women and 36 men took part, with the 'robot' being the most popular activity.

"Approximately 15 balls ended up in the dock but we didn't have to go for a swim to recover them!

"It was a great event surrounded by the historical buildings in the Royal Albert Dock."
