

Hundreds take part in TT Kidz programmes

TT Kidz programmes kicked off all over the country this week, with over 350 children taking part.

In total 29 table tennis clubs signed up to deliver the eight-week programme, which was created by Table Tennis England to primarily get more young people playing the sport.

Almost half of the programmes sold out, with some increasing capacity to accommodate the high levels of interest.

Caroline Gallacher, whose son Harry attended a session at Westfield Table Tennis Club in Wellinborough, said: "It was a fabulous first TT Kidz session. Harry absolutely loved it, and the instructors were brilliant."

The highest number of participants have been 27 at Horsham Table Tennis Club in Sussex and 26 in Cliffedale Chandlers in Grantham, Lincolnshire.

The following programmes also sold out: Halton Table Tennis Club (Widnes), Goodwin Table Tennis Club (Hull), Ormesby Table Tennis Club (Middlesbrough), Swerve Table Tennis Club (Middlesbrough), Luton Table Tennis Club (Bedfordshire), Water Lane Table Tennis Club (Hertfordshire), Ramsbottom Table Tennis Club (Bury), Whittlesey Table Tennis Club (nr Peterborough), Birmingham Table Tennis Academy (Birmingham), Kingfisher Table Tennis Club (Reading) and Wigginton Table Tennis Club (York).

Greg Yarnall, Head of Development and Volunteering at Table Tennis England said: "It has been fantastic to see TT Kidz come to life this week.

"We have been delighted with the response and the number of young people signing up to have their first experience of table tennis.

"We now have an opportunity to show the 350+ young people and parents who signed up what a great, fun game table tennis is."

As well as getting a whole new generation of children playing our great game, the programme also set out to increase the number of young people working as activators and coaches.

Greg commented: "We have seen a really good response from clubs in this regard, with a number of sessions being led by completely new young coaches and activators."
