It could be someone like our 2018 winner, Philip Batchelor. Parkinson's patient Philip was determined not to let the condition dictate every aspect of his life, but was apprehensive about attending Stroud Table Tennis Club for the first time.

He feared that someone who was unsteady on their feet and with shaking hands would not be welcome and that he wouldn't be good enough, but with support from club members giving him table time and a few tips, he gradually developed his technique to such an extent that he could play 20–30 shot rallies.

His story was told in this short video by self-shooting director Rufus Exton:

Jim Hurford, Chairman of Stroud Table Tennis Club said: "Of course Philip's movement is severely restricted but in spite of that, he has made the most of his natural ability, improving remarkably during his time at the club (he has a mean forehand!).

"I think this is because he has found an activity in a supportive environment which he enjoys and can join in with and because of his determination. It is a pleasure having Philip in our club and he is certainly an inspiration to me as I'm sure he will be to many others who see his film."
