Paul Whiting said: "Mentoring is an incredibly good way to develop your skills as a coach, learn new things and also increase your confidence as a coach.

"For me, mentoring as part of my UKCC Level 4 qualification was really important. It gave me a chance to discuss things with another coach, talk about the practices I was using and maybe come up with some ideas of how to improve those practices."

The Coach Mentoring Programme builds on support we have offered coaches during the recent lockdowns and periods of restriction, including our series of webinars on a wide range of subjects.

And although it is important to offer this support during this period of uncertainty, the Coach Mentor Programme will continue to be of huge benefit to the coaching community well beyond that as we move back towards normality.
