Salcey Forest, Northamptonshire

This magnificent woodland has many miles of ancient wood banks, building remains and ancient trees. The 'druids', or veteran oaks, are rare and amazing wildlife habitats, and some of the old oaks are over 600 years old. Have a go on one of their two tables set in this beautiful landscape!

Packed full of beautiful parkland, you'll find a Ping! table located next to the stunning lake, and you might be able to spot a variety of water birds and other wildlife while you play!



Woodthorpe Grange Park

Woodthorpe Grange Park is an impressive large green space that sits on the edge of the city. You can find one Ping! table next to the children's play area surrounding by beautiful trees.



Jesus Green, Cambridge

Jesus Green is an area of open parkland grass, north of Cambridge city centre, home of one of the last remaining outdoor lidos in England, and the longest at 91 metres in length. The Ping! table has an inspiration setting right next to the River Cam.
