Derbyshire's Isobel Ashley, the 3rd seed had an up and down weekend but still battled hard to take a creditable 5th place but the surprise in the girls event was the performance of 12th seed Letitia McMullan from Hampshire claiming 6th spot where her 7out of her 13 wins included a number of notable scalps.
