Filton's first team of Jack Cross, Oliver Tyndall, Jake Young and Henry Jones proved the team to beat in the Under 13 development event. They overcame Bournemouth 1 and Plymouth 6 -4 in two nail biting matches before really turning up the heat and dominate Bournemouth 2, 9 – 1 in the final match of the day and this gave them the title.
