## South Yorkshire athletes celebrate Paralympic Day

Some of South Yorkshire's 2012 hopefuls were on their marks to celebrate International Paralympic Day.

Victoria Bromley and Adam Thompson, part of the British Table Tennis Association for the Disabled, hosted a special demonstration at their training base – the English Institute of Sport in Sheffield (EISS).

They were joined at the world-class Sheffield International Venues (SIV) facility by Rotherham cyclist, Dominic Hurley.

Dominic, 38, who lives in Dalton, Rotherham, said: "It is really exciting that the Paralympics is being recognised in this way with a whole day of celebrations across the country."

Class 11 table tennis players Victoria, 25, and Adam, 23, are preparing for the European Championships, in Croatia, next month.

Victoria said: "There is so much excitement about 2012 and it is great to celebrate with an event like this bringing together athletes from other sports who are also training for the Paralympics."

International Paralympic Day is being celebrated across the UK today (Thursday, September 8) before tickets for the London 2012 Paralympic Games are launched tomorrow, Friday, September 9.

In the capital, a full day of activity is taking in Trafalgar Square giving the public a chance to find out about each of the 20 sports to take place at the London Paralympics.

Sheffield recently celebrated one year to go until the 2012 Paralympic Games by hosting an international training camp for the Canadian men's and women's wheelchair basketball teams at EISS.

The venue provides a training base for many of the GB wheelchair basketball squad as well as GB Paralympic boccia players and fencer Craig McCann.

Paul Hudson, general manager of EIS Sheffield, which is operated by Sheffield International Venues (SIV), said: "It is great to kick off ticket sales for the Paralympics with this celebration of local sporting talent at EISS. The city is home to many athletes training day in day out for the Paralympics."

Councillor Helen Mirfin-Boukouris, Sheffield City Council's Cabinet Member for Business, Jobs and Growth, said: "Sheffield is home to many GB Paralympians, as well as several international Paralympic teams using our outstanding facilities to train in advance of the London 2012 Games. I am sure the people of Sheffield will join me in getting behind all these athletes to offer them our full support for next year."
