In the final she met Ekaterina Guseva (the current world number 297) who she beat 3-0 to claim the title.

Emily actually comes from the same school that former Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher went to, but with such an important tournament coming up the school work will have to wait for the time being!

She will be supported in Poland by her father who is flying out today.

The European Championships runs from 8th-16th October 2011.
