Each County elects a representative to serve on the National Council of the Table Tennis England and attend meeting four times a year. The Councillors receive reports from Board members and discuss topics of interest to table tennis in England.

They have a dual function: to act as an advisory panel to the Board; and to act as a liaison point between the counties, clubs, players and/or special interest groups they represent.
