were undefeated in OC's A's 7-3 win over ECC A. Crouchman ran out a 3-1 winner against all three ECC players – Mark Mulley, Reuben Okai and Steve Kerns. The match between Elmtree Graphics A and Bocking finished as a 5-5 draw. Paul Davison was on top form for Bocking. He scored an excellent hat-trick of three- straight wins against Gary Young, Gary Baker and Glenn Johnson.

James Denyer had to settle for two wins in Maldon B's 6-4 win over Danbury A. He missed out 10-12, 12-10, 9-11, 11-7, 11-13 against Michael Andrews. It turned out to be a good night for Andrews who also beat Minda Sinkus 6-11, 11-9, 11-5, 4-11, 12-10.
