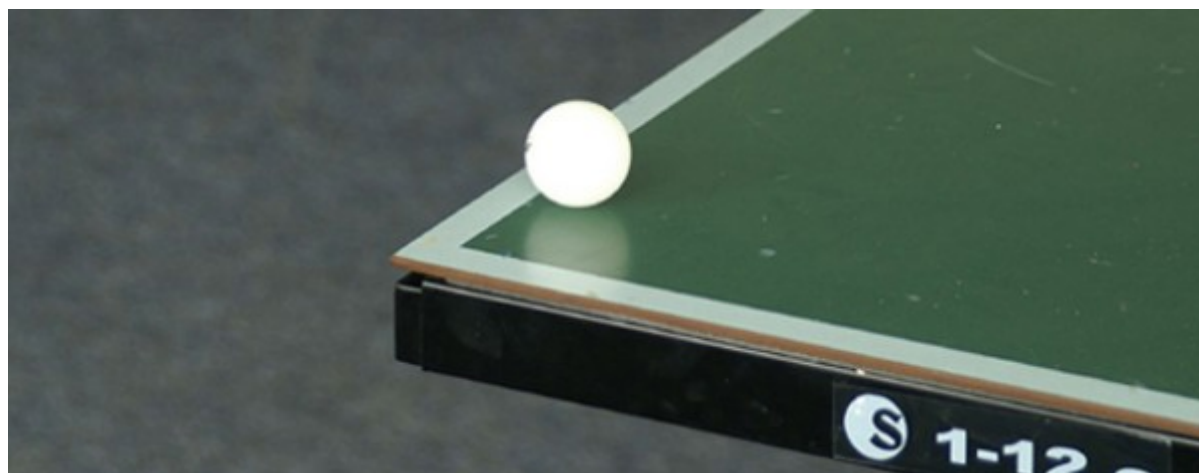

Junior Boys Singles

Adam Cross beat Tobit Dehnen 3-2 (8-11, 12-10, 9-11, 11-4, 13-11).

Although officially an under 18's event both boys are 15 which bodes well. Tobit played a blinder and looked odds-on at 9-3 up in the fifth. Adam, however, kept his nerve very well to triumph ahead of his Club Singles success.

Handicap Singles (21 up).

Aman Rashid beat Conor Wilde (received 4) -16, 20, 21.

Marvellous final which went right to the wire and, at 21-21 in the final game, was, literally, there for the taking by either player. Both lads showed class in abundance with the winner just 14 years old.

Handicap Doubles (21 up).

game.

Veterans Singles.

Les Baker beat John Underwood 3-0 (11-5, 11-6, 11-8).

Karen Rogers earlier in the week retained the **Ladies Singles** title against Shirley Pickering as well as beating Les Baker in the **Hard Bat Singles**.
