England double up at Senior Schools' Champs

National Head Coach Nick Jarvis said: "It was great to see the English schools doing so well at the championships.

"Liam McTiernan proved his standard by winning the Under 18 Boys singles and, with Luke Walsh, to win gold in the team event. It was particularly pleasing to see three of the players who are playing in the European Youth Championships winning double golds in the singles and the team – mainly Maria Tsaptsinos and Letitia McMullan."
