Not to be out done Charlotte McCarty from Northfield TTC also took home 2 titles winning the Junior Girls Plate and the Under 13's Girls beating Charlotte Weatherby in both finals. The under 13's girls plate was Won by Holly's sister Lilly Williams beating Darlington's Georgina Peart in the Final.

Georgina also reached the Final of the Cadet Girls plate but this time found Kelsey Bradley to strong going down in 4 games.

The Under 13's boys saw a repeat of the cadet boy's semi-final, Siraj vs Dai again another cracking game saw Harry Dai again come out on top with a 3-1 victory. The all Bishop final saw Carl get a 2-0 lead before Tom fought back to 2-2 before

Carl moved up a gear to take the 5th Set and his first title.
