The National Junior League (South) season was completed at Cippenham on Saturday, 1st March, with the fourth set of matches played to a finish. Pride of place goes to Chiltern A, who won the Boys' Division 1, thus taking 1st place out of the 18 competing boys' teams. Harry Collins went through the whole season unbeaten, with excellent support from Mike Rutherford, and some valuable wins from no 3 player, Alistair Smith.

Two 12 year-olds, Reece Chamdal and Josh Selby, did the most damage, each winning 5/6 on the day. Credit to Forum, who could so easily have fixed the result of A versus B, but instead elected to fight out their own fierce battle! ETTA medals were awarded to the top six teams, decided on an accumulative basis, which brought in Reading A (4th), Kidlington Forum B (5th) and Graham Spicer (6th). The runners-up medals went to Cippenham A (Jemma, Megan, Rosalind Lane and Louise Williams), just ahead of Ellenborough (Talia, Amelia Chan, Angela Ai and Rachael Herriott).
