Alan Ransome has been presented with an honorary degree from Teesside University.

"It really is a whole army of people who have made it possible and for that I am very grateful.

"I have had to be the coach or the captain and lead them, but the point is that you cannot undertake this kind of thing on your own.

"You have to be part of a team."

At the ceremony, Mr Ransome also encouraged students to experience the benefits of them sport.

He said: "I would like students and graduates alike to be aware what sports can do for them. It has helped me over the years and it can improve communities and themselves.

"There are numerous benefits of being involved in sports and it's an education in itself."
