A strong season from the Halton D team saw them win the **Third Division.** An unbeaten final day in Cheshire ensured the Halton team remained in the top after impressive displays throughout the year. On the last day the team won 28 points out of 30 available, winning by a margin of 33 having started the day 12 points clear.

The star of the show throughout the season for Halton D was No 1 player Ryan Makin. He won 33 of his 38 matches, to take second place in the league averages, behind unbeaten Thomas Bawn, from Ellesmere Port, who played 30 matches.
