The chance to take on one of the star players had Nottingham's citizens flocking to the tables – and there were plenty of other fun challenges too, including 'choose your weapon', 'around the world', 'bling your bat' and the robot challenge.

"It goes to show it really is for everybody - no matter what age or level of fitness you can enjoy it."

Sam Walker added: "It's been a great day and a great publicity event for the sport. We had a lot of interest in the city and a lot of people asking questions and wanting to play.

"It doesn't matter how old people are, they're giving it a go and enjoying it and that's what sport is all about – even at the elite level you've got to enjoy it."

Desmond Douglas was a big attraction, with numerous requests for photos and interviews. He said: "It's been a good day for table tennis, a good promotional day with a lot of interest from the public and from TV, which is always good. I've really enjoyed it."

Table Tennis England Chief Executive Sara Sutcliffe, who was interviewed on Sky Sports News, said: "It's a celebration of our fantastic sport, showcasing just how much fun it can be and how easy it is to pick up a bat and play."

Sam Walker was also on hand at nearby Rushcliffe Country Park, alongside players from Central College, to launch their new outdoor tables.
