## Drinkhall back in Olympic Park three years on

"It's a great honour to be back at the site of some of the biggest moments in British sporting history – and I loved playing against Paul!"

"Almost three years on from London 2012 it's fantastic to see more than 5,000 residents living in the former Athletes' Village.
