



Friday Photos No 58: A tribute to Bernard Crouch

I had the enormous pleasure this week of being contacted by Rob Crouch, the Great-Nephew of former England International player, Bernard Crouch, who was tragically killed in the Barnes railway accident in 1955. Bernard was just 30 years old at the time. Rob has kindly forwarded me copies of some photographs and pictures of trophies and medals along with several press cuttings.

Bernard was a Senior International of some prominence being the holder of a bronze medal in the Swaythling Cup in 1950 when he played for the England team in Budapest. Indeed, Bernard gained his first international cap at these championships against Brazil. The other team members were: Richard Bergmann, Johnny Leach, Aubrey Simons and Harry Venner – certainly an elite list of names. Bernard also played in the World Championships in 1948 and 1954, in the latter year he reached the last 16 in the Men's Doubles with Peter Cruwys and the last 32 in the Men's Singles. Considerable achievements in what many regard as the heyday of English table tennis.

The English Open saw further success with a Quarter Final place in the Men's Singles in 1949 and two Quarter Final slots in the Men's Doubles in December 1950 with Peter Skerratt and 1952 with Ivor Jones. December 1950 also saw Bernard holding a Runners-up trophy in the Mixed Doubles with Vera Thomas (Dace), herself a World Champion, and, a trophy as the winner of the Consolation Singles.

On the domestic front Bernard was a member of the winning Wilmott Cup team for the Staines League in 1954/55. He was also on the Middlesex County Championships winning side in 1947-48 and 1949-50 to 1955.

Like many other top class table tennis players of the era, Bernard was an excellent tennis player. He was a regular member of the Surrey County side and played at Wimbledon on several occasions. However, racquet sports were not his only forte, Bernard played football as an amateur for Staines Town and cricket for the Laleham Cricket Club.

A rare sporting talent whose life was cut short. Those who knew Bernard paid some wonderful tributes to him, not only for his achievements but for his demeanour and sportsmanship.

"He will always remain in my memory not only as a great friend, but as a person who played the game as it should be played. Players of any sport, and I say this particularly for the younger generation, could do no better than to emulate his fine example". Michael Thornhill. Friend and team companion.

"He (Bernard) was for many years a welcome visitor to tournaments and matches in Surrey and we shall miss this popular and sporting player". Colin Clemett. Surrey TTA.

It has been a privilege to be able to pay tribute to one of English Table Tennis's former stars.
