

Clacton & District: Tricia turns up trumps

Tricia Salter may not have been in the running for an award for best-supporting actress at this week's Oscars' ceremony – but she'd be top of the list of nominations for best-supporting table tennis player in the Clacton & District League.

This week, Tricia produced an excellent unbeaten performance to return her fourth hat-trick of the season as **Division Two** leaders Windsor Owls consolidated their position at the top of the table by beating Windsor Harriers 10-0 for a second time.

Team-mate Mark Salter conceded just 78 points to win his three whilst Frank Burbidge's maximum was harder-fought, needing an 11-8 in the fifth result to beat Isabel Barton.

But it was the often under-rated Tricia who turned up trumps, the Owls' No 3 player adding three valuable points to her team's tally, defeating Ferdy Rodriguez 3-1 (11-9, 11-5, 9-11, 11-8), Isabel Barton 3-2 (11-1, 7-11, 11-4, 11-13, 11-7) and Jenny Higgins also in five (11-9, 10-12, 11-5, 15-17, 11-5).

Second-placed Nomads Tigers beat Brotherhood F 8-2 although the match-score disguised a much closer battle with five individual matches going the distance and only two settled in three-straight. Roger Hance and Daryl Lott both took trebles, both defeating Lee Allen by the same 11-8 in the decider score, whilst John Marshall's two for the Tigers included an 11-9 in the fifth victory over Sandie Isaac.

Lee Allen was Brotherhood's best player on the night and was involved in yet another five-setter when he beat Marshall 11-8 in the fifth. But the closest match of the encounter was the doubles, Isaac and Barry Allen just getting the better of Hance and Lott 14-12 in the fifth.

Nomads Bobcats defeated Windsor Magpies 7-3 with the Two Tony's – Robinson and Beezer – excelling to secure maximum points. Malcolm Caley was the only Windsor player able to stretch them, taking both players to a fifth set. Harry Beezer came close to adding to the Bobcats' total but he was edged out 11-7 in the fifth by Caley and 11-6 in the fifth by Dave Sweetland.

Division Three pace-setters Nomads Pumas were without Eric Lemke for their clash with Nomads Leopards but even his presence might not have been sufficient to prevent the Pumas from a second defeat in as many weeks, the rampant Leopards emerging 7-3 winners. Jason Lloyd and Ethan Lloyd both stayed unbeaten, with Ethan Lloyd's 11-8 in the decider win against Lionel Goddard the only match going the distance.

Walton D stay second following a comfortable victory against Nomads Lynx. There was just one awkward moment for Walton, Rivhu Khan and Toni Hayhow-Khan eventually getting the better of Paul Dale and Liam Harris 3-2 (11-9, 9-11, 9-11, 11-5, 11-4) in the doubles.

The all-Nomads clash between the Wildcats and the Ocelots was always going to be a close-run affair and so it proved, the Wildcats taking it by a narrow 6-4 scoreline. Brian Friday of the Wildcats beat Scott Campbell 11-6 in the fifth to seal his maximum whilst Andrew Cawley contributed a couple, although he couldn't out-point Campbell who won their individual match 11-7 in the decider. For the Ocelots, there were two for Campbell and one each for Tom Collins and Mike Wellum.

Windsor Ospreys' better-than-expected season continued with an 8-2 result against Windsor Swallows, Debra Found and Woody Fitzpatrick recording trebles. The Ospreys were fortunate to take the two matches that went the distance, Found beating Iris Howlett 11-9 in the fifth, and Found and Fitzpatrick edging the doubles in five (11-4, 11-13, 11-6, 12-10) against Howlett and Kayley Lamb

There were two each for Jackie Bunce, Alan Charman and Ron Dacey as Windsor Penguins defeated Windsor Kites 7-3. But none of them could get the better of the Kites' hat-trick hero Chris Simson, a winner 11-5 in the decider against Bunce and 11-8 in the decider against Dacey.

Brotherhood G were 8-2 victors over Nomads Cougars. Graham Healy and Rob Bright stayed unbeaten, with Jo Millar taking one and sharing a doubles success with Bright. Gill Knights, with a tight 3-2 (1-11, 11-9, 10-12, 11-9, 11-8) win over Millar, and Zoe Strange were the Cougars' points scorers.

Nomads Panthers, champions-elect of **Division One**, were without a game and so the spotlight centred on three of the four teams aiming for the runners-up spot, all three of their respective matches ending 7-3.

Windsor Eagles defeated lowly Windsor Kestrels, Phil Smith's treble achieved with a hat-trick of three-straight wins. But Mark Smith's maximum was harder-attained, taken the distance by both John Harvey and Bob Sawyer. For the Kestrels, there was a point apiece for Harvey, Sawyer and Graham Bunce, with Harvey's nailbiting 3-2 (12-10, 12-14, 11-9, 4-11, 15-13) victory over John Hobson the closest match of the evening.

Felipe Rodriguez and Andy Vincent were Windsor Hawks' maximum men as their side inflicted a 7-3 defeat on bottom team Brotherhood D. Hawks' skipper John Barton will feel unfortunate not to have added to his side's total, going down 11-8 in the fifth to Paul Alden and 11-9 in the fifth to Russell Hillier.

But Walton C, without Gary Young, were on the wrong end of a 7-3 result against a full-strength Brotherhood C team which included Kevin Gowlett and Alan Burgess. Both Gowlett and Burgess stayed undefeated although Burgess had to fight hard against Paul Meikle and Derek Willis, defeating both players 11-8 in the decider.

Five of the matches went the distance in an encounter between two evenly-matched mid-table teams, with Walton B finally edging it 6-4 against Brotherhood B. All three of Paul Woolnough's singles went the distance, defeating John Owen and Brotherhood reserve Grant Sharpe but losing out to Martin Edwards. Gavin Price also won a couple for Walton but he couldn't overcome man-of-the-match, Edwards who won their individual encounter in five (11-13, 6-11, 11-8, 11-8, 12-10).
