

Chelmsford & District: Peverel set tone with whitewash

Every now and then a result comes through that really takes your breath away. Hatfield Peverel B, the early leaders in division three of the Chelmsford & District Table Tennis League produced the week's outstanding performance and arguably the most outstanding display of the season so far when they defeated third-placed Danbury F 10-0.

Dave Fiddeman, Neil Freeman and Gareth Davies were all undefeated as the tried and tested Danbury trio of Dave Marsh, John Robinson and Herbie Smith drew a complete blank. Gareth Davies downed the challenge of John Robinson 3-2 (11-9, 10-12, 11-5, 7-11, 14-12) in the night's closest encounter.

Hatfield Peverel Captain Neil Freeman commented: "We can't believe the start we have made to the season – a great all-round team effort."

Maldon B scored their first win of the season and they did well to beat Danbury H 8-2. Tom Elder and Ev Lucas were both undefeated.

Danbury G were also clear-cut winners and Dan Anderson and Sam Lowman were both undefeated as they beat OCs E 9-1. Anderson had to pull out all the stops to get the better of Nat Ravlic 3-2 (11-4, 11-13, 11-4, 8-11, 15-13).

Galleywood A are the early pace-setters in division two and James Hicks was again on top form as they drew 5-5 with second-placed Hatfield Peverel A. Hicks downed the challenge of all three Hatfield Peverel players – Gary Ward, Peter Brownlow and John Gagg 3-0.

Liberal B are also strong at this level with both Adrian Pitt and Andrew Huckson in their line-up and they both stayed undefeated in their 8-2 win over Danbury C. Without Pitt they weren't quite so potent and they lost 7-3 to Danbury D. Steve Buer was the top player in this match, notching up an impressive hat-trick of successes against Robin Armstrong (3-0), Andrew Huckson (3-1) and Paul Lombardi (3-0).

Last year's champions Danbury A have taken little time to establish themselves at the head of the division one table and they were able to include a reserve – Neil Want – in their line-up as they beat OCs A 9–1. Left- handers Gary Young and Matt Spero both won their three singles for the defending champions, whilst Daniel Berry was on target for the Old Chelmsfordians side. He beat Neil Want 3–0 (12–10, 11–7, 11–8).

Hatfield Peverel C were impressive 10-0 winners over Danbury K in division four. The scoreline may have flattered them slightly as they won all four five-setters, but Trevor Collin, Dave Carter and Bob Garson nevertheless carried all before them. Carter beat Scott Perry 3-2 (11-6, 9-11, 11-7, 8-11, 12-10) in the closest game of the evening.

Danbury J have jumped into second place, courtesy of their 8-2 win over OCs F. Brian Ellis (three wins), Dave Goody (two wins) and Richard Allan (two wins) all played a part in their success.

Writtle Excalibur C came out on top 6-4 after a close match against Danbury L. Steve Siggs was the Writtle Excalibur match-winner on this occasion.

Galleywood B have jumped into second place in division five and with both Mark Glenister and Kamil Lentas in their line-up they beat OCs G 8-2. Nathan Blore chipped in with a 3-2 (11-9, 8-11, 11-4, 9-11, 11-9) win over Mike Morecroft.

Galleywood had to face OCs H without Glenister and the Hatfield Peverel side took full advantage, winning 7-3. Tanish Kotwal won his three singles to give the Old Chelmsfordian side the edge and Lawrence Bartlett picked up two wins. Kotwal downed the challenge of Kamil Lentas 3-1 (11-9, 11-8, 1-11, 11-9) in the night's top encounter.

Writtle Excalbur E (Brian Steward, Colin Griffiths and David Meah) all won twice in their 7-3 victory over Hatfield Peverel D although they all missed out to Dan Patynski.

Writtle Excalibur D were 6-4 winners over Chelmsford H. Melanie Bonnett won her three singles and she completed her hat-trick with a 3-1 (11-9, 11-6, 7-11, 11-8) victory over Connor Payne.

Highwood (Martin Goddard, Tim Smith and Russell Downton) ran out narrow 6-4 winners over newcomers Anglia Ruskin University. However all three Highwood players lost out to an impressive Pewist Osman. OCs J (Adam Chalk and Harry Rogers) gave nothing away in the CLICK League where they beat Buttsbury B (Chris Stephens and Harry Hutt) 5-0.
