This month focuses on one of our most prominent and successful female players ever and current Table Tennis England President, Mrs Jill Parker, MBE.

In her playing career Jill reached No 1 in England (for many years) and also became European No 1 and 6 in the world. Honoured with an MBE in 1979, Jill also received several table tennis honours and awards including the Victor Barna Award in 1973, 1974, 1975, 1976 and 1979, the AK Vint Staff Award in 2011 plus becoming a Vice-President in 1989.

Jill's playing record is outstanding, seven times English National Women's Singles Champion, eight times Women's Doubles Champion and twice Mixed Doubles Champion. At the English Open, Jill won the Women's Singles on three occasions and the Women's Doubles twice.

In 1976 Jill won two gold medals at the European Championships; in the Women's Singles and Women's Doubles with Linda Howard (Jarvis). Jill also became Champion in the Europe Top 12 on three occasions. The Commonwealth Championships saw a further eight gold medals to add to the tally.

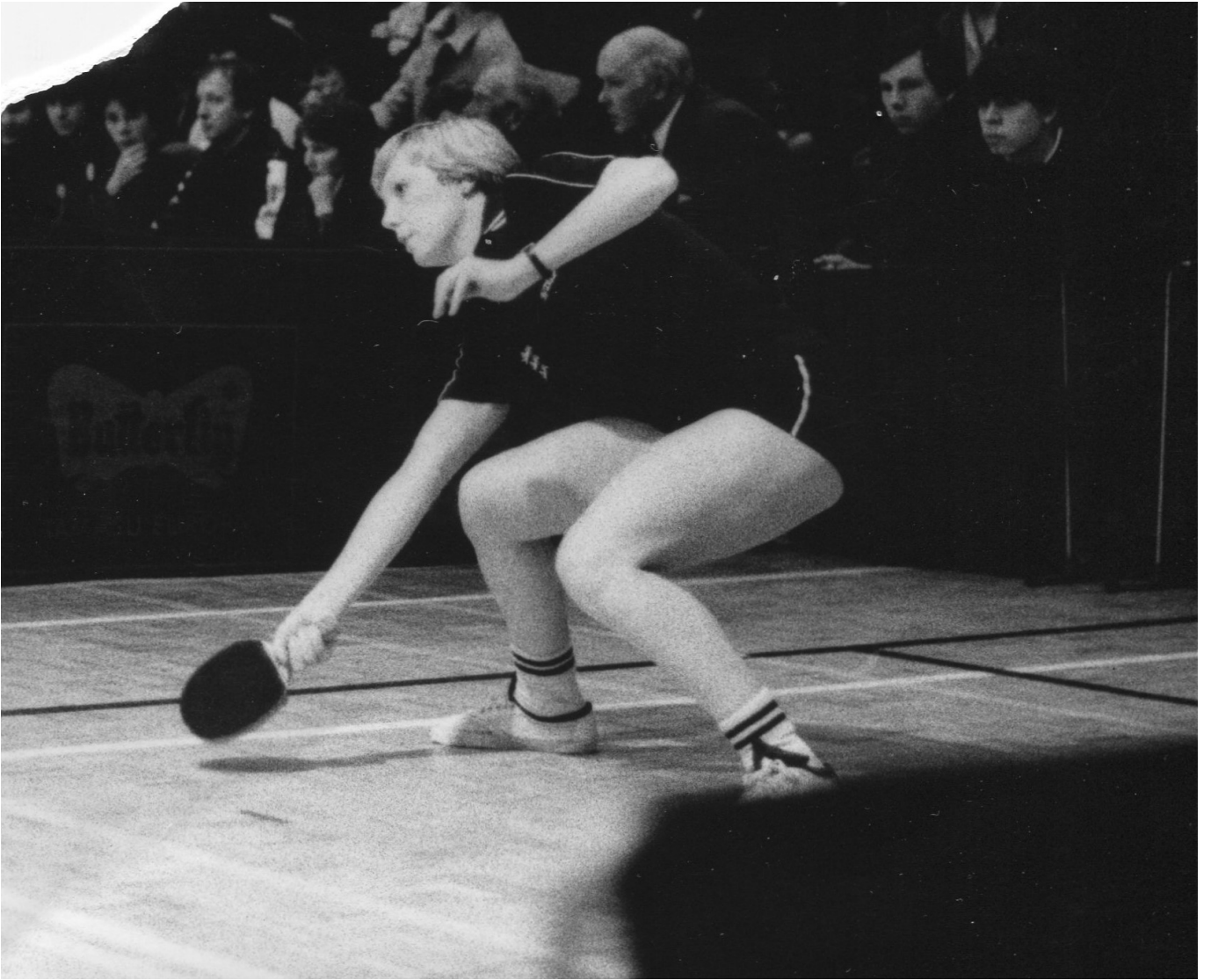

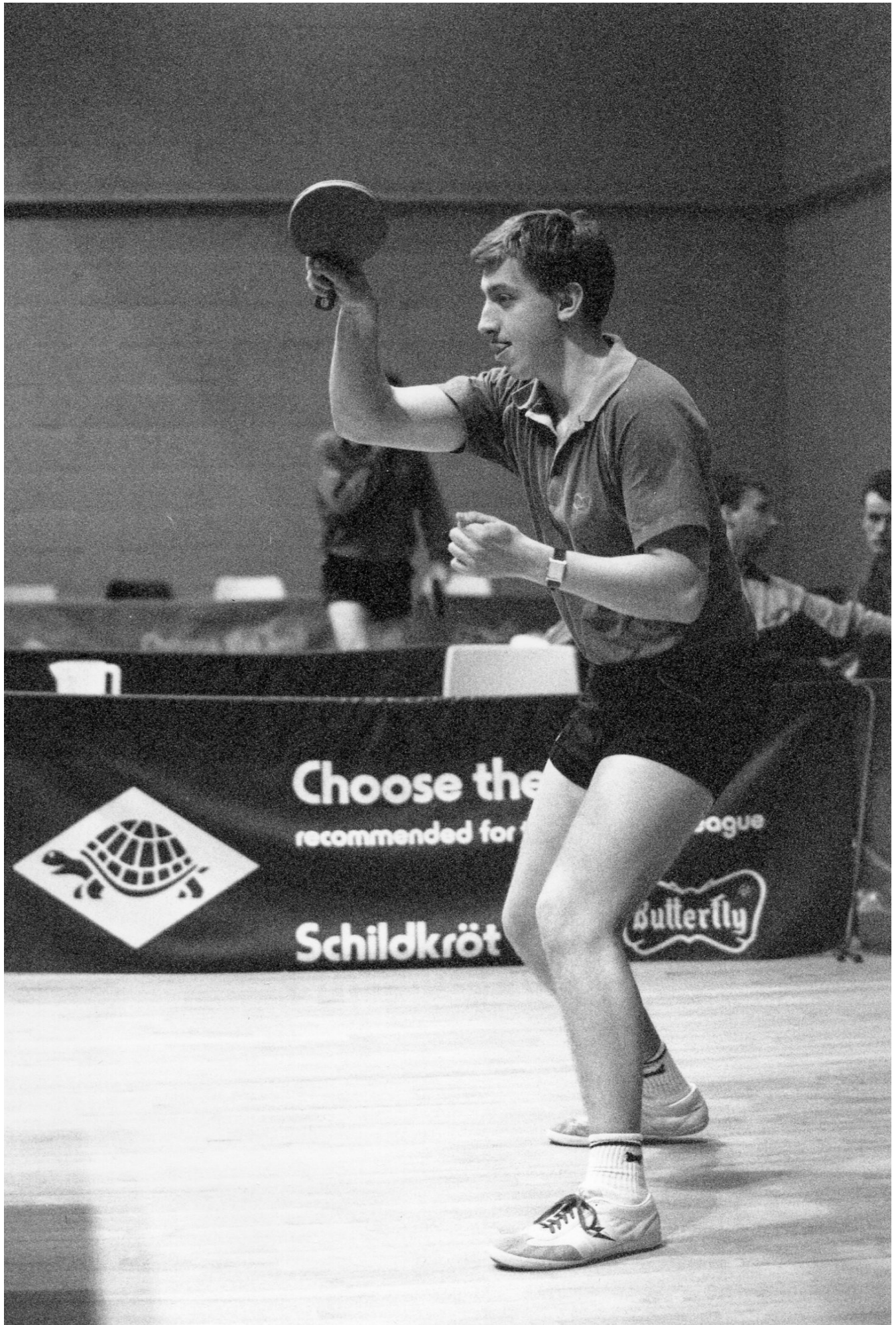

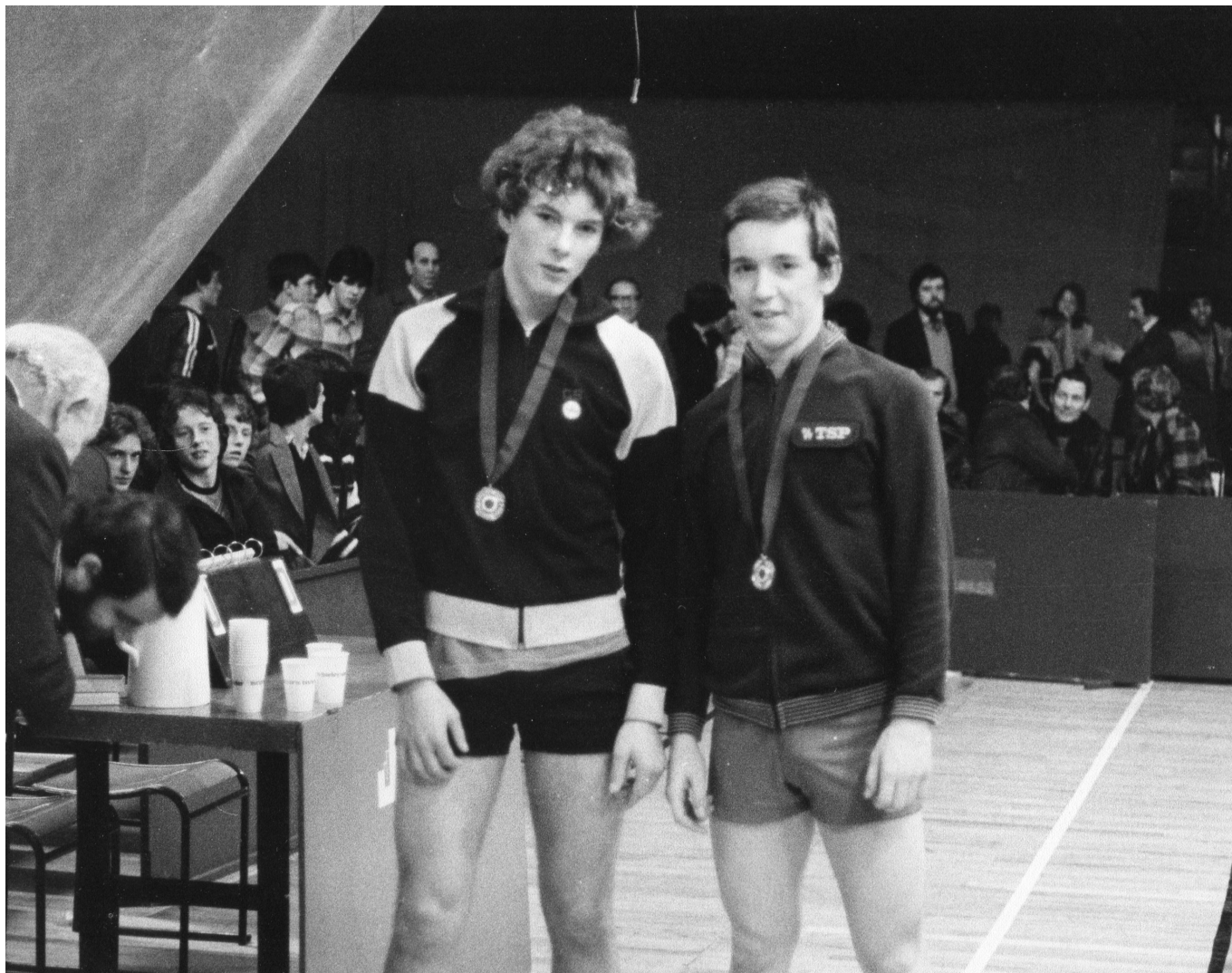

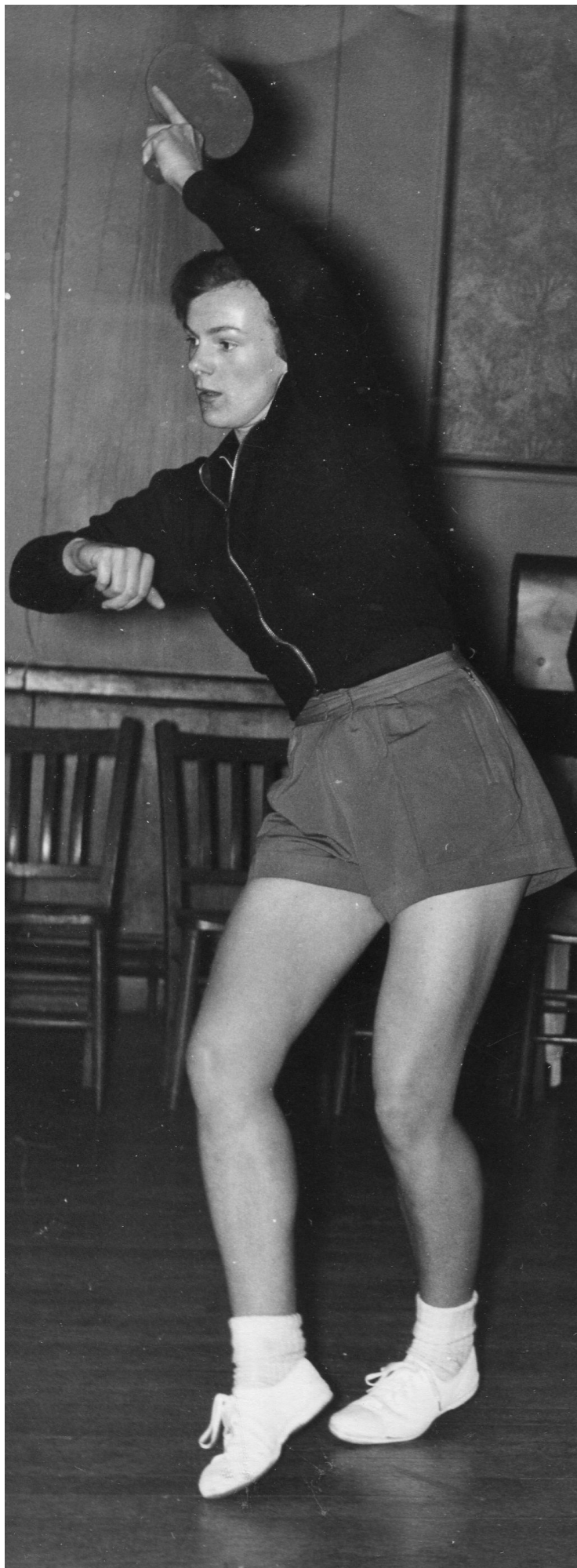
