

# Harefield seal thrilling double at Jack Petchey finals

Harefield Academy, Burlington Danes Academy and Barnes Primary School were all double winners at the Jack Petchey London Schools Table Tennis Team Finals.

University College School and Ernest Bevin College completed the roll-call of champions as 188 youngsters representing 41 teams played their hearts out across four age groups at the University of East London.

The most thrilling final was the Under-19 boys, in which Harefield Academy and Whitgift School could only be separated by countback. And with the score at 4-4 and the set score at 18-18, it had to go all the way down to points, with Harefield shading it 334-322.

And to add to the drama, Harefield also had to battle from 3-0 down as England Youth Squad member James Smith, George Hazell and Reiss Vydelingum had won their opening matches. Israel Awolaja put Harefield on the board against Jason Kwok, James Chappell beat Smith to make it 3-2 and Gaurav Aravind levelled by defeating Vydelingum.

When Awolaja saw off Hazell, Harefield led for the first time. But Kwok came from 2-0 down to beat Lee Clark to tie up the scores and ensure calculators were needed to declare the winners after a match in which five of the eight individual matches went to a deciding fifth set. For Harefield, it was a step up after finishing as runners-up last year.

Harefield made it a double in the top age group when their line-up of Zahna Hall and Sarah Menghistab won the round-robin group without dropping a match, thereby retaining their title. The format included four singles and one doubles match. Morpeth School beat Eastbury Comprehensive 3-2 to seal second place.

At the other end of the age scale, Barnes Primary School won both Under-11 titles, overcoming reigning champions Asburnham Community School 5-3 having trailed 1-0, 2-1 and 3-2 before winning the last three matches.

The Barnes girls improved on last year's second place, defeating Ashburnham 6-2. The winning line-up was Annelise Williams, Riva Hempsall, Lauren Hodgins and Hannah Chaudhury.

Ernest Bevin College took the Under-16 Boys' title but not before a superb semi-final in which they needed countback to see off Burlington Danes Academy. Trailing 3-1 and 4-3, Howard Onweng won the crucial match against Ryan Stewart to make it 4-4 – Ernest Bevin winning by 16 sets to 14 on countback. The final was more straightforward as they defeated Sacred Heart Catholic College 5-1.

In the Under-16 Girls, Burlington Danes retained their title with a 5-1 victory over Holland Park Academy. The third-place play-off was another close one as Sacret Heart edged out London Academy 13-12 on sets after coming from 2-0 and 4-2 down to force a 4-4 draw.

Burlington Danes also came out on top in the Under-13 Girls round-robin, a competition in which no team was unbeaten. Burlington beat Morpeth School and Richmond Park Academy but lost to Barnet, meaning countback was needed to place the champions above Richmond Park, who won their other two matches. Barnet were third.

The Under-13 Boys' event went to University College School, who came from 3-2 down to defeat Ernest Bevin in the final. It was Ben Barbarash's win over Jeremiah Prempeh which proved key, as he took the deciding fifth set 12-10 to put his side 4-3 ahead.
