two gold medals.

Romford teenager Jack Stockdale made a winning start to his international career in Para table tennis by taking gold in the men's class 10 singles at the Lignano Junior (U23) Open. Paul Karabardak won gold in the men's class 6 singles, with the rest of the GB team performing strongly. Tom Matthews (men's class 1), Sue Gilroy (women's class 4-5), Martin Perry (men's class 6) and David Wetherill (men's class 6) all took bronze in their respective classes. Tom Matthews added a team silver on the final day, alongside his partner Endre Major.
