

# Clacton & District: Super-fit super-vets at double

The legs of super-veterans Derek Willis, Paul Meikle and Colin Dearman were made to work hard this week but the three players proved up to the task to record two excellent wins – in two different guises.

On Sunday at the Brotherhood Hall they represented Clacton in Division Two of the **Super-Veterans Section of the Essex Inter-League** and the trio recorded an excellent 8-1 win over their Chelmsford counter-parts. Willis and Dearman won both their singles whilst Meikle had a 12-10 in the fifth win over Chelmsford's Mo Hardy. In addition, they took three excellent doubles victories.

Then, on the following night, the same threesome took to the table as Walton B in **Division One** of the Clacton & District League and chalked up a 9-1 victory against Windsor Kestrels. Willis and Dearman again stayed unbeaten although Dearman had tight tussles before beating Colin Beaumont 3-2 (11-7, 11-8, 9-11, 8-11, 11-7) and Dave Martin also in five (10-12, 11-9, 10-12, 11-8, 11-8). The Kestrels earned fulsome praise for their determined spirit with John Harvey playing particularly well, his 3-0 (13-11, 11-5, 11-8) win over Meikle in the first match of the night the only blot on the Walton copy-book.

Elsewhere, Nomads Panthers marched on at the top with a hard-fought 8-2 victory over Walton A, James Denyer and Sam Hume both taking maximum points. In a battle of the hard-bats, Denyer defeated Kevin James 3-2 (11-7, 12-10, 8-11, 13-15, 11-4) whilst, in another close encounter, Hume edged out Gary Young 11-9 in the decider. Young and Gavin Price won a point apiece for Walton but James failed to get on the scoresheet after losing 11-5 in the fifth to Gill Locke.

Second-placed Windsor Condors had a somewhat easier task against Lawford and came out comfortable 10-0 winners, Greg Green, Martin Hogg and Felipe Rodriguez all recording trebles.

Windsor Eagles were 7-3 winners over a Nomads Lions' team that contained two reserves. Phil Smith and Gary Cattermole remained undefeated although Cattermole struggled to overcome both Nomads' reserves, beating Ethan Lloyd 11-6 in the fifth and Jason Lloyd 12-10 in the fifth.

Three each for Alan Burgess and Oli Reynolds, and two for Kevin Pryor, saw Brotherhood C home 9-1 against a Windsor Hawks' side fielding a reserve. Three of the Brotherhood points came from matches which went the distance, Pryor beating George Berry 11-4 in the decider whilst it was 3-2 (11-5, 12-14, 11-9, 11-13, 11-9) for Reynolds against Windsor skipper John Barton in the first match of the evening and 3-2 (11-4, 11-9, 8-11, 10-12, 11-8) for Burgess against the unlucky Hawks' captain in the last match of the night.

The log-jam at the top of **Division Two** is beginning to clear with Brotherhood H and Brotherhood D now emerging as clear promotion favourites.

This week Brotherhood H's best threesome – Stewart Murray, Grant Sharpe and Graham Parkes – won 9-1 against a Nomads Tigers' side which included a guest player. John Marshall of the Tigers played well to beat Sharpe 11-9 in the fifth and take Murray to a fifth set.

It was also 9-1 for Brotherhood D in their encounter with Brotherhood F, another side which used a guest. The 'F' team's Barry Allen beat Lee Harvey in match one but that proved to be his team's only success. Three of the 'D' team's wins went to a decider, Paul Alden and Russell Hillier against Barry Allen, and an 11-7 in the fifth victory for Harvey against Lee Allen in the closest match of the contest.

Nomads Bobcats' charge up the table continued and they moved into third place following their 9-1 success against Walton C. Jason Lloyd and Ethan Lloyd with three each, and Andrew Cawley with two, took their points. Rivhu Khan beat Cawley 3-0 (11-8, 11-5, 11-8) for the Walton point.

Scott Campbell and Mark Ratcliff stayed unbeaten as Brotherhood I inflicted an 8-2 defeat on Brotherhood E, although Campbell only just got the better of Rodney Betts in five (8-11, 13-15, 11-6, 11-4, 11-8). Duncan Dunne picked up a point for the losers by edging out Mark Beckham 11-9 in the decider but the 'E' team will feel boosted by taking only their fourth doubles success of the season, Dunne and Cris Edwards defeating Campbell and Beckham in three-straight.

David North made a first appearance of the season for Nomads Jaguars to cover for absent players and took his three as the Jaguars beat a weakened Windsor Buzzards 8-2. Andrew North and Allen Denyer won two each for the Jaguars, Denyer enjoying a 3-2 (6-11, 11-6, 12-10, 9-11, 11-7) victory over Alan Rutledge and a 3-2 (6-11, 11-13, 11-5, 11-5, 11-9) success over Windsor reserve Debra Found. Ray Chillingworth took the Buzzards' points.

The all-Windsor clash between the Harriers and Magpies ended predictably in a 10-0 win for the Harriers. Ferdy Rodriguez's 3-1 (11-9, 11-5, 8-11, 11-7) victory over Kayley Rodriguez was the only match which went to a fourth set.

In **Division Three** Walton D breezed past Nomads Leopards 10-0, the same score by Nomads Wildcats defeated Windsor Swallows.

Brotherhood G were 9-1 winners against Nomads Ocelots. Paul Metcalf and Rob Bright both took hat-tricks with Dominic Joannou getting the losers' consolation point. But the Ocelots came close to getting a couple more, Hunt needing all five sets to defeat Sue Lee whilst Metcalf only just got the better of Joannou 11-9 in the decider.
