Futures squad.

Harry Watson and Robyn Cosgrove were selected by the Talent Development programme to go to Sweden on a training camp. They will now be going to play in the Croatian Open later this month along with Anais O'Connor.

Back at base in Halton the Senior British League Premier team had two home matches, losing 1-7 to Drumchapel Glasgow but then on 15 April securing their first win of the season, beating Cardiff City convincingly 6-2 with Richard Lightowler, man of the match Kevin Dolder and Jake Shaw securing the wins supported by Kin Fung Chan.
