<p>Criteria Summary</p>	<p>East Dorset District Council 16 and above offer a sports and arts grant application service for individuals The funding normally ranges between £100-£250 depending on the different categories specified in the application. This fund can also be used to support elite sports performers and or their coaches.</p>
<p>Criteria Summary</p>	<p>Poole Sports Development 16 and above Offers the opportunity to fund coaching or receive bursaries for formal coaching qualifications up to £250. Ideally the sport that the applicant participates in should be recognised by Sport England or an olympic sport.</p>

Devon	Active Devon Bursary
Criteria	16 and above
Summary	Bursaries will only be allocated through an application process by National Governing Bodies (NGBs). NGBs will identify coaches who meet their Whole Sport Plan priorities, meet the needs of Devon County Council's funding conditions and meet the eligibility criteria laid out for the scheme. Following a panel assessment, NGB officers will be informed of the outcome of the application. Candidates will then be able to access the bursary by completing the Active Devon Coach Bursary Registration Form and submitting full payment of the course to Active Devon. An agreed level of bursary will be returned to the candidate upon completion of the course (or at a timeline specified by the NGB). Bursaries of up to 50% of the cost of the course will be made available to candidates identified as a priority to the NGB. This is subject to a maximum of £100 for Level 1, £150 for Level 2 and £500 for Level 3 qualifications. Any coaching awards or qualifications can be funded. These can be National Governing Body Awards or UKCC qualifications. Generic workshops such as First Aid or Equity in your Coaching are not eligible for funding. Applications to receive bursary funding will be assessed by a panel of representatives from Active Devon and Devon County Council against specified criteria.
