Learning Objectives

By the end the course the candidates will be able to:

Identify the role of the referee. Be aware of pre-event planning and preparation

Schedule matches and do the draw, manually and be aware of IT systems used.

Identify the roles of the 'event team' and lead them to deliver a well organised high quality and enjoyable tournament for participants

Deal with queries competently and in a customer friendly manner at the event and avoid confrontation.

Be aware how to calculate the results in a group of players'. Review evaluate and report on the tournament

Know how to gain experience through mentoring, to become a first class referee

Referees perform a vital role in the game, with the growth of popularity of table tennis the demand for match officials is increasing. Can you rise to the challenge?

To then qualify as a Tournament Referee, a candidate needs a year's experience as a County Umpires and some experience in tournament organisation and management. There is then a written test but those who pass who do not have the necessary experience will be registered as a provisional Tournament Referee and must then provide evidence of such experience to complete the qualification
