### FINAL

Genovese had progressed through his group unbeaten but some very close games, not least of all a three-gamer against Harry White who was giving away 4 points per game. Steve Pratt did well on the day to win two from three, including a 23-21, 22-20 defeat against the eventual winner.

The other group, despite all the set being won in two games, was much closer in that no-one won all three nor lost all three with Small and Peter Wilson emerging with the two positive scores. In this case it was the match between the two decided as their games were also identical which was the easiest looking of the lot.

A feature of the final stages was that nine out of ten of the original group winners play in Division Two of the Leicester and District League.
