Equipment Guidance

Indoor table specifications:

NATIONAL LEAGUE 22 ROLLAWAY

A 22mm Butterfly match top is combined with the 8 wheel system which provides economic storage.

This is the ideal table for schools. Recommended as a quality match 22mm 8 wheel style table.

- Adapted to meet the requirements to be wheelchair friendly
22mm match quality playing top
- Protective, strong steel 30 x 38mm frame with stable magenta corner pieces Supported by a heavy duty undercarriage
- Four independent wheels on each half
- Wheel brakes on each side for use in the storage and play positions
Height adjusters on all four legs to ensure a level playing surface
- Locking system for safety and stability
Playback facility
- Takes up minimal space, due to 8 wheel storage system
- Conforms to and certificate issued for the new Central European Norm (CEN) safety regulations: EN 14468-1
- Provided with a Butterfly Elite Clip net and post set

The curved legs of this table make it extremely attractive and the design means this table will fit perfectly in the environment of a school. The feet are equipped with adjustable screw fittings so that it can be installed in public places. The permanent leg assembly and fixed steel net can't be removed. With a fully weatherproof playing surface and FFTT (French Table Tennis Association) approval for leisure use, this table is a firm favourite with schools.

How many tables can we apply for?

You can apply for either four or two indoor tables and/or two outdoor tables. However no school will be awarded more than one package. The package of two indoor tables has been introduced for schools who cannot store 4 tables at their premises.

Why are Table Tennis England asking for a monetary contribution?

The Table Donation Scheme is generously funded by the Jack Petchey Foundation. To allow the Scheme to benefit as many schools as possible all successful applicants are asked to make a small contribution towards the costs of the package they are awarded.

Why do we have to sign a table donation agreement form?

All successful applicants are asked to sign a form agreeing to the usage of the tables to ensure the highest outcomes of the scheme.

Why do recipients have to provide data on usage following the Scheme?

As part of the funding agreement Tennis Table England must report back to the Jack Petchey Foundation on the success and reach of the Table Donation Scheme. This also helps monitor the impact on participation levels. Schools are asked to fill out a monitor form in intervals after receipt of their tables.

When is the deadline for applications and when will we hear if we are successful?

Applications can be made by clicking here. The closing date for applications is **9am Friday 16th June 2017**. After the closing date all applications will be reviewed by an assessment panel with confirmation of the status of your application, sent out from mid-June onwards.

Our school already has tables (through the Table Donation Scheme or otherwise), can we still apply?

Yes you can still apply. In your application you need to show how your school has made the most of the tables you already have and young people would benefit further by having more tables. However please remember the scheme is primarily aimed at those who have not been part of the table donation scheme before and have no or very few existing tables.

When can we expect delivery of our tables?

Equipment delivery will be arranged once your signed donation agreement and contribution has been paid. You will be contacted directly by the equipment suppliers who are:

We expect deliveries to take place during July. Should you be successful with your application, please ensure you have returned the relevant information and payment to allow deliveries to take place.

What is a suitable surface for the outdoor table?

If you do not intend to secure the table to the ground then grass or tarmac is fine although you would need to consider wear to grassy areas around the edge of the table. It is advised to secure the table to the ground. If this is your preferred option then it would be best to use a concrete base. Any surface should be as level as possible but the feet of the table could be packed if necessary.
