Don joined the Liverpool & District
Table Tennis League Management
Committee in 1974 as the Match
Secretary with responsibility for
managing and organising Liverpool
teams in the Lancashire and Cheshire
League and other inter league
competitions at all levels. He was also
responsible for organising the Liverpool
teams in the English Leagues Cup
Competitions (ELCC) competitions.

During this period Don was also the press Officer for the LDTTL ensuring that regular reports were posted in the local papers and was on the organisation committee for the ETTA Grand Prix and Junior competitions when they were held in Liverpool up to 2014.

In 1999 Don was appointed as the Chairman of the LDTTL and he has been



in that post for 21 years until the end of the 2020 season.

Don has now retired from the LDTTL Management Committee after 46 years' service. He is still registered as a player with the LDTTL and affiliated with TTE. His service will be missed but I think that his service should be recognised.

Elected to the ETTA Selection Committee in the mid-1970s after coaching a number of young players at his club in Reading to achieve national and international success.

Omega, later to be called Kingfisher, provided England with a number of its team players including Commonwealth and England Champions Matthew Syed and Karen Witt, Olympian and English Champion Alison Gordon (Broe). The creation of an expectation to be 'as good as you can be' resulted in the club helping many successful players over many years.

Became Chairman of the ETTA Selection Committee in 1979 that at the time was not only responsible for international teams, their training, talent identification and development



but also ranking. The lists were produced based on the opinion of the National Selectors. In the early 80s, a computer was used for the first time in this country to produce the ETTA Ranking lists.

On the retirement of his mentor Ron Crayden, he was appointed Vice Chairman for Selection and Coaching on the ETTA Management Committee until the late 1980s when a change of ETTA Chairman meant a sabbatical into football.

Under ETTA Chairman Alex Murdoch, returned to his previous role as V/C Selection & Coaching and Chair of BTTF Selection Committee for the 2012 Olympic Games.


